Therefore, because of the growing milieu of academic cheating in our nation's school, and the growing apathy toward it; drastic measures were needed to bring integrity back into the academic arena. Moreover, as Christian educators we cannot turn a blind eye to the fact that academic cheating, in the form of plagiarism has found its way to our campus. Hence, we must do all that we can to discourage this practice and take measures to develop a "culture of accountability" in our school to prevent plagiarism.

Therefore, because of the growing problem of Plagiarism on college campuses all over the country the following policy shall be adopted by all students of RCTBS when writing a research paper:

1. All cited material used in a student's research paper must be properly footnoted.
2. A Bibliography must be included with the research paper for all cited material.
3. Any student using information from the Internet, must not only properly cite the information, using the proper format for footnoting information from the Internet. But, they must also **provide a copy of the article, with the cited material underlined or highlighted, and place it in an appendix at the end of the research paper.**
4. Any student failing to provide the proper documentation of information used, and failing to provide a copy of an Internet article in the appendix of their paper **Will Not Receive Credit For The Project.**
